1989 : An American Victory? For a Reassessment of the End of the Cold War.

Pierre Grosser is a Professor of History at the Centre d'Histoire at Sciences Po Paris and former Directeur des Etudes of the Institut diplomatique of the Ministère des Affaires Etrangères from 2001 to 2009. He specializes in the history of the Cold War (*Les Temps de la guerre froide*, Complexe, 1995) and the origins of wars (*Pourquoi la Seconde Guerre mondiale ?* Complexe, 1999). He has just published the book *1989. L'année où le monde a basculé*, Perrin.

Jérôme Heurtaux is a Professor of Political Science at the University of Paris-Dauphine and a member of the Institut de Recherches Interdisciplinaires en Sciences Sociales of the CNRS. His field of study is mainly the sociology of regime changes and democratic transition particularly in post-communist Europe. He is the editor (with Cédric Pellen) of *1989 À l'Est de l'Europe. Une mémoire controversée*, La tour d'aigues, Éditions de l'Aube, which has just published.
